CONSIDERATIONS WHEN CHOOSING A HIGH SCHOOL



TYPES OF BPS HIGH SCHOOLS

Open Enrollment

Comprehensive high schools that every student living in Boston is eligible to apply for.

Special Admissions

Schools that require an extra application to be considered for admission.

Applications could include an essay, teacher recommendations, and/or an audition.

Exam Schools

Schools that require a GPA of a B or higher and an admissions test to be eligible for admission.

Boston Latin Academy, Boston Latin School, and the John D. O'Bryant School of Mathematics and Science

Alternative Schools

Schools and programs for students who are not succeeding in a traditional school setting.

Offer intensive support services and different approaches to learning.

BPS PATHWAYS TO COLLEGE AND CAREER READINESS

Early College

Early College Pathways allow students to receive a high school diploma and up to two years of free college credit by taking a mixture of high school and college classes during their school day.

Advanced Placement (AP)

Traditional advanced coursework, giving students the chance to tackle college-level work and earn college credit while in high school.

Innovation Pathways

Designed to provide students with a coherent sequence of coursework and experiences that are aligned to region specific high-demand industries.

International Baccalaureate (IB)

An academically challenging and broad advanced work program that provides an internationally accepted qualification for entry into higher education.

Career & Technical Education Pathways

Provide hands-on applied learning experiences that build career readiness skills and specific technical skills that lead to industry recognized credentials.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT

What is Advanced Placement (AP)?

- Advanced Placement courses are college level courses that are offered at high schools to provide students an opportunity to earn college credits.

The Student Experience

- Students will participate in a year-long AP course, which has a standardized test associated to it that occurs at the end of the year.
- Depending on a student's performance on the AP examinations, they will be given a score from one to five (1-5). Colleges and universities may grant placement and course credit to students who obtain a qualifying score.

The Results

- Depending on their AP exam scores, some colleges may exempt students from introductory coursework, while others use them to place students in higher designated courses, and some do both.

INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE

What is International Baccalaureate (IB)?

- An internationally recognized educational program that offers a rigorous and balanced curriculum.
- Aims to develop students who are intellectually curious, globally aware, and prepared for success in higher education and beyond.
- Designed to foster critical thinking, intercultural understanding, and a holistic approach to learning.

The Student Experience

- A student can enroll in the Diploma Program, which includes six subject groups: Studies in Language and Literature, Language Acquisition, Individuals and Societies, Sciences, Mathematics, and the Arts.
- Emphasis is placed on developing a well-rounded student with a broad skill set.

The Results

- The IB Diploma is internationally recognized. It's offered by around 150 countries globally and recognized by colleges and universities from almost 90 countries.
- The IB curriculum also teaches students to be outward-facing and culturally aware, so they are well prepared as global citizens.

EARLY COLLEGE

What is Early College?

- With Early College Pathways, students can experience both the high school and college student duality. It's a chance to look ahead and explore some career choices.

The Student Experience

- Students receive wrap around supports, including tutoring, mentoring, and advising, to ensure they are successful
- Students are a part of a cohort where all students in the pathway are taking college courses together
- Students spend increased time on college campuses, taking classes alongside full time college students

The Results

- Students graduate with at least 12, and up to 30, transferable college credits at no cost
- Students can graduate with both a high school diploma and an Associates Degree at no cost, depending on the program

- Innovation Pathways give students in-depth learning in a particular industry to prepare for further study and/or employment in that industry
- Innovation Pathway course sequence includes 2 technical courses and 2 college level courses

The Student Experience

- Enhanced supports that are integrated into academic program
- Career development activities that occur along the pathway
- Students are exposed to many careers within an industry sector
- Students are required to complete 100 hr internship or capstone

THE RE-ENGAGEMENT CENTER (REC)

Who are we?

As the only Boston Public Schools program that targets dropouts, the REC has a caring and accessible staff. We offer students access to the resources and counseling needed to re-enroll in school and recommit to graduating. One of the first programs of its kind nationwide; the REC has found that dropouts want to come back to school and can succeed when given the right support.

The REC works in partnership with Boston Private Industry Council.

What do we do?

- **OUTREACH** via mail, phone + door knocking
- **TRANSCRIPT** evaluation to determine next steps
- **OPTIONS** for online credit recovery, night school, and day and summer school courses
- **REFERRALS** to the best BPS high school or Alt Ed Program for you
- **GED** program referral

- **WORKSHOPS** for life and career
