Dear Parent/Guardian,

Boston Public Schools would like you to consider the opportunity for your child to attend one of the district's three exam schools for the 2024-2025 school year: Boston Latin Academy, Boston Latin School, and the John D. O'Bryant School of Math and Science. The BPS exam schools are among the top performing free public schools in the country and offer students a college prep curriculum, opportunities for sports, student club activities, and partnerships with area colleges and businesses.

Admission to these schools is based on a student's performance on the exam school admissions test and course grades in English Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies. Interviews and recommendation letters are not required nor accepted. All three schools accept students entering grades 7 and 9. The John D. O'Bryant School also accepts a small number of new students for grade 10.

In July 2021, BPS selected the NWEA MAP Growth Reading and Mathematics assessment as the admissions test for the exam schools. **BPS students already take the NWEA MAP Growth assessment** up to three times at their current school as part of district required testing to help schools and teachers inform academic instruction, as well as assess student growth. However, only the test scores from specific test administrations are eligible for consideration in exam school admissions.

The MAP Growth assessment is a computer adaptive test in Reading and Mathematics. Computer adaptive tests adjust to each student's learning level. If a student gets a question wrong, the next question will be easier. If a student gets a question right, the next question will be harder. The next administration of MAP Growth will take place during the normal school day between Tuesday, May 30, 2023, and Friday, June 2, 2023 **for students in grades 5 and 7.** Specific testing dates within this period will be determined by your child's school. Pre-registration for the test is not required. The test scores from this test administration will be used for the exam school admissions AND provide schools with important information regarding your child's progress since the start of school. Makeup testing will be available if the student is unable to be assessed during the first week.
