6th Grade – The Max Warburg Courage Essay Contest

The Max Warburg Courage Curriculum's "Courage in My Life" sixth grade program is a language arts and character development curriculum used in Boston Public Schools.

The program "empowers students to realize that their actions and decisions can be powerful agents of change. Through reading, writing, and discussion, students discover and recognize the role of courage in the lives of the characters they read about, in the lives of those around them, and in their own lives—past, present, and future".

The writing component of the program has each student write an essay on the topic of "Courage in My Life." Each of the Roosevelt's 6th graders essays was submitted and the judges selected Natalie Trapanick and Maureen Baumiller to be 2016 Max Warburg Fellows. As a 2016 Max Warburg Fellow, these students will have their essay and photo published in *The Courage of Children: Boston and Beyond Volume XXV*.

In addition, they will attend an Annual Awards Luncheon at the Fairmont Copley Plaza.
