Grade 2	Sum- the total amount resulting from the addition of two or more numbers.		
Grade 3	Operations, addition, subtraction, division multiplication, factors, prime factors, symmetry, perimeter, grid, area, rectangle, dimensions, estimate, square.		
Grade 4	Estimate- to find the closest answer by rounding the numbers before calculating.		
Grade 5	Equivalent- equal in value.		
Grade 6	Length- the distance from one end to the other end of an object.		
Grade 7	Coeffiecnt- the number that multiplies a variable in a linear equation.		
Grade 8	Systems of linear equations- two or more linear equations that represent constraints on the variable used. Solution of a system of equations- a pair of values that satisfies all the equations in a system.
