Goal for BPS Summer Experiences:

The main goal of our summer programs is to create opportunities, and essential services for *all* students to participate in the Best Summer learning experience to fit their personalized needs and attain their academic goals.



5th Quarter Summer Learning Academy Highlights

We offered more than **91 summer learning academies** and community based program opportunities across all regions within the city of Boston.

The city became our student's classroom.

Students had more than **128 summer learning opportunities** focused on academics in the morning and enrichment in the afternoon.

Course Completion and Credit Recovery

33 schools offered credit Recovery and Course completion opportunities for grades 6-12.

Approximately 1,800 students took advantage of credit recovery opportunities this summer.

C2K partnered with **24 libraries** and engaged with **450** children throughout the city to celebrate and prepare them for Kindergarten

Boston Children's Museum hosted 1,021 visitors for Countdown, 383 kindergarteners and 638 family members.

Summer Early Focus

Participation Data

Summer Early Focus served **429 children** aged 3- 9 years old at 4 sites city wide: East Boston EEC, Hennigan K-2, Curley K-2, Ellison Parks. The program achieved an overall summer **attendance rate of 88%.**

Students participated in enrichment activities such as dance, science, physical education, and neighborhood field trips.

20% of our Families attended workshops across the 4 sites

Exam School Initiative (ESI)


- Equity initiative designed by the Office of Opportunity
 Gaps to diversify admission to the district's 3 exam schools
 by increasing access to traditionally underrepresented
 communities: Black, Latinx, Multilingual Learners and
 Students with Disabilities.
- Invitation-only program for rising 5th, 6th and 8th grade students who are invited to participate centrally and through a school nomination process.
- Curriculum reinforced content standards skills in ELA and Math, and habits that are most critical for success in the next grade through high-quality culturally affirming content.
- This summer's program included project-based learning with the incorporation of STEAM and the Arts.

EXTENDED SCHOOL YEAR (ESY) 2024 HIGHLIGHTS

- The 5 week program: Monday, July 8th through Friday, August 9th
- Location: 13 sites around the city
- Family Engagement: outreach efforts, including weekly communications and robocalls, led to improved family engagement
- Enrichment Opportunities: Whale and Dolphin Conservation (WDC) Group, Einstein's Workshop, Mini's with a Mission
- Enrollment: 2,052 students participated in the program this summer






EXTENDED SCHOOL YEAR (ESY) 2024 Attendance


