3. What We Are Learning

What we are learning: Facilities Assessment

Walk-throughs of 19 prototype buildings for both facility condition and current educational use have confirmed:

- Building infrastructures are generally sound, but the facilities needs are extensive due to overall condition and age of buildings.
- Smaller buildings in particular, especially at the K-8 levels, have uneven distribution of spaces such as cafeterias and auditoriums.
- Schools cite lack of appropriate spaces for critical educational needs, particularly student support services.
- Further upgrades may trigger code compliance requirements.

What we are learning: Grade Configurations

The lack of coherence in grade configurations presents both educational and operational challenges.

What we are learning:

Demographics and Enrollment

- Enrollment has declined steadily over the past 10 years, due in part to enrollment loss in grades 5-8.
- Specialized programs are scattered around the city.
- Charters continue to be a significant and competitive factor.
- BPS enrollment is not keeping pace with Boston's population growth.



Tenets for maintaining robust enrollment

- Ensure quality schools close to home
- Reduce transitions, simplify grade configurations
- Create program models that lead to equity for all students
- Increase capacity for early childhood education
- Provide capacity for future growth
