Predictable Pathways Creating a system that provides quality for all students

Our proposed changes make significant progress towards more predictable pathways with the goal of one point of transition for families:

- The Irving and Timilty Middle Schools will close in June 2022, at the end of next school year and will continue to enroll students in grades 6-8 in the 2021-2022 school year
- This will reduce the number of transitions for families and simplify the assignment system, and provide us with an opportunity to significantly upgrade our buildings
- All middle school facilities <u>will be</u> renovated for continued use by Boston public schools



School Choice and Process by Grade The Timilty Middle School will continue to serve students in grades 6, 7 and 8 for school year 2021-2022. In January 2022 at the earliest, students will re-enter the school choice process for September 2022:

- Grade 8 students will transition to a BPS school serving grade 9 in Fall 2022. Timing for grade 8 school choice begins in January 2022.
- Grade 6 and 7 students will also take action and begin school choice selection process in January 2022 at the earliest to enroll in a new school for grades 7 and 8.
 - Recognizing that Grade 6 and 7 students will go through an unplanned transition, the <u>Welcome</u> <u>Services team</u> is supporting students who experience closure with dedicated supports

- TechBoston (Dorchester)
