
Cohort 2008 (N=5,080)** 4-Year vs 5-Year Graduation Rate



With an additional year, the graduation rate for students who entered high school as freshmen in 2004 (the 2008 Cohort) increased 6.4 percentage points, from 59.9% (4-year graduation rate) to 66.4% (5-year graduation rate). The increase represents an additional 326 members of the 2008 cohort graduating from the BPS after an extra year in school.

Cohort 2008 (N=5,008)** 4-Year vs 5-Year Graduation Rate By Race/Ethnicity




With an additional year, the graduation rates for every racial/ethnic group in the 2008 cohort increased. The additional year seems most beneficial to Black students, who saw a 7.3 point increase (156 students) in their 5-year graduation rate, compared to the 4-year rate; Hispanic students experienced a gain of 6.9 points (110 students); Asian students gained 4 points (17 students); and White students gained 4.4 points (35 students).

- An additional year in high school benefited both male and female students: the 5-year graduation rate for males in the 2008 cohort increased by 7.4 percentage points compared to the 4-year rate. Similarly, female students saw a 5.5 point increase in their graduation rate with the additional year.
- Of the 834 Limited English Proficient (LEP) students who were part of the 2008 cohort, 375 students (45.0%) graduated in 4 years. An additional 87 LEP students graduated after staying in school an extra year, resulting in the 55.4% 5-year graduation rate. The 5-year rate for students receiving special education services was up 9.6 points (93 students); and was up 6.5 points for low income students (256 students).

- With an additional year in high school, the percentage of students who graduated increased across all except three high schools (Quincy Upper had 96%, Health Careers 91.5%, and Boston Arts Acad 83.5% graduation rate). The increases ranged from 21.2 percentage points at Boston International High, to 0.5 points at O'Bryant.
- The 5-Year graduation rate target for 2010 AYP has not been released by MA ESE as of March 8, 2010. If it remains unchanged from 2009, 12 high schools would meet the 2009 requirement of 70%. However, only Brook Farm high school would benefit from it because the other 11 schools have also met the 2009 4-year target of 65%, or a 2 point increase from the previous year.
